Jim Bethke said that there have been a lot of trees down due to the recent storms that have come through. He has been clearing those and hauling gravel. The new grader has arrived and he has been using it.

Jim has talked with Burnett County about the when we could get their dump truck. (This purchase was approved in March 2023) They are unsure of when it could happen. Jim has found a different truck that would be comparable to that one. He would like to put a bid on it. The Board agreed as the funds have been approved. However, if we got the dump truck that he puts a bid on, we would not be getting the one from the County.

Jeremy Gronski said that he had to talked to Dutch at Grantsburg about purchasing the old grader and the red dump truck. If they do not want them, we will put them out for bid. We can also check about listing them on the Wisconsin Surplus website or Machinery Trader.

Burnett County District 4 Supervisor Update 8/8/2023:

All departments are working on the proposed 2024 budget and will be coming before the appropriate committees this month.

<u>Comprehensive Planning Committee:</u> The committee met on July 31st. They have completed updating all chapters of the County's comprehensive plan and have moved on the reviewing the mapping section. Once Northwest Regional Planning has completed the interactive map for the County, they are planning to send the link to each municipality for review. The Municipalities can submit any corrections using the mapping system. Once this is complete the county comprehensive planning committee will meet October 9th.

Land Use Committee: The committee met on August 1. They held a public hearing on the 4 CUPs, 3 rezone requests and review of a preliminary subdivision plat.
