Burnett County District 4 Supervisor update 2/11/2025:

Land Use Committee: The committee met Feb. 4<sup>th</sup>. They held public hearings on items consisting of 1 rezone request and two conditional use permits. The rezone was approved by the committee and will now go before the full County Board for final approval.

One CUP was approved and one CUP decision is delayed and will continue review next month.

Approved: Conditional Use Permit #CUP-25-03: Chinander – Home Occupation of Gunsmith in A-2 Agricultural-Residential District

Approved: Rezone Request #MAP-25-01: Thoreson – Rezone from RR-2 and A-2 to C-1

Delayed to next month: Conditional Use Permit #CUP-25-04: Camp Croix Association, Inc – New Multi-Purpose Building, Relocate 17 Cabins and Repurpose Bathhouse into Two ADA Compliant Apartments in RR-2 and RR-3 Residential Districts

The committee continues the review of potential changes to Land Use Ordinance Chapter 30 – Articles I and II. They are planning to hold a public hearing in April on the proposed changes.

Health & Community Services Committee: The committee met this afternoon.

Veterans Service Officer reported due to an overload of out of state Veterans requesting assistance from this county office, along with limited resources and funding of the county, Burnett County Administrator Ehalt has directed the office to cease assisting clients from out of state without administrative approval and instead focus our time and resources on our Burnett County Veterans.

There is concern with the Federal funding freeze due to the uncertainty of how this may affect our County. Burnett County Administration is actively monitoring the situation and has contingency plans in place to manage any potential funding delays.

The committee also received reports from each department within HHS and approved to fill 1 vacant position.

Infrastructure Committee: The committee will meet Feb. 12<sup>th</sup>. From the material in the committee's packet: Building maintenance reported they had a sewer line freeze and breaking during the extreme cold temperatures. They were able to get it repaired.

The Highway Department has been busy with road maintenance, salt sanding, brushing, building maintenance, cleaning and organizing, training on winter maintenance items, chainsaw training, taking care of salt deliveries and working on project projections for 2025.

Natural Resources Committee: The committee will meet Feb. 13<sup>th</sup>. From the material in the committee's packet: The Conservation Department has been working on updates to the Animal Waste Storage and Nutrient Management ordinance.

Tree sale order forms are slowly coming in.

The 2024 WI Deer Donation Program report was given. Block & Cleaver and Lock & Load were the only two deer processors in Burnett County. Between them they received 5 deer and donated nearly 175# of venison to the local food shelves.

Forest & Parks presented the 2024 annual report and worked with the DNR on the 2024 financial audit of the timber sale closeouts. Total timber sales for 2024 were just over \$1,538,000.

They are also working on the 2025 Tree Planting contract and plan to have 165,600 trees planted on 184 acres.
